Turning on/Turning off: Individual Differences in Sexual Inhibition and Excitation

You are invited to participate in a research study to investigate how people react to a variety of sexual situations and stimuli. You clicked on an Internet link to this study and can exit at any time. You must be at least 18 years old to participate. We ask that you read this form and ask any questions you may have before agreeing to be in the study. The study is being conducted by Erick Janssen, Ph.D. of The Kinsey Institute for Research in Sex, Gender, and Reproduction.

STUDY PURPOSE

The purpose of this study is to investigate how people react to a variety of sexual situations and stimuli.

NUMBER OF PEOPLE TAKING PART IN THE STUDY

If you agree to participate, you will be one of 500-20,000 participants in this research.

PROCEDURES FOR THE STUDY

If you agree to be in the study, you will complete an online questionnaire about how people react to a variety of sexual situations and stimuli. The questionnaire takes about 5 minutes to complete. You can choose to participate anonymously or not. No identifying information will be kept in the dataset that contains your answers to the questionnaire. If you are a registered 10ML user, we may connect your answers from this study with your demographic information or answers to any other 10ML studies. However, we will not connect it directly with your identity or contact information. If you are not yet a registered 10ML user, at the end of this study you will be sent to an optional registration page.

RISKS OF TAKING PART IN THE STUDY

While in the study, the risks are:

- possibly being uncomfortable answering the questions.
- possible loss of confidentiality.

Questions about sexuality can make some people embarrassed or uncomfortable. At any time, you can decline to answer specific questions or completely exit the questionnaire. The questionnaire is anonymous unless you choose to give us an e-mail address for us to notify you of future studies. We ask that you complete the questionnaire in private so your answers will not be revealed to anyone.

BENEFITS OF TAKING PART IN THE STUDY

Excitation/Inhibition Questionnaire

There is no direct benefit to you, but you will be helping better understand how people tend to react, in terms of their sexual arousal, to a variety of sexual situations and stimuli. At the end of the study, you will be able to view results on how you scored on this questionnaire.

CONFIDENTIALITY

Please complete the questionnaire in private. Your data will be anonymous unless you are a registered 10ML user or choose to register with 10ML at the end of the study. 10ML registration will allow us to link your answers across studies while keeping your identity and contact information confidential and separate from the answers you provide to study questions. Efforts will be made to keep your personal information confidential. We cannot guarantee absolute confidentiality. Your personal information may be disclosed if required by law. Your identity will be held in confidence in reports in which the study may be published and the databases in which your results may be stored. Organizations that may inspect and/or copy your research records for quality assurance and data analysis include groups such as the study investigator and his/her research associates, the Indiana University Institutional Review Board or its designees, and (as allowed by law) state or federal agencies, specifically the Office for Human Research Protections (OHRP) who may need to access your research records.

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
